

Chief Minister Sindh appoints Dr. Mujeebuddin Sarahi as Vice Chancellor of SMIU for Second Tenure

The Chief Minister of Sindh, who is also the Chancellor of public sector universities in the province, appointed Prof. Dr. Mujeebuddin Sahrai Memon as Vice Chancellor of Sindh Madressatul Islam University, Karachi, for a further period of four years, effective from August 13, 2024.

According to a notification issued by Mr. Noor Ahmed Samoo, Secretary of the Universities and Boards Department, Government of Sindh, on Tuesday, April 9, 2024, the Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah made this decision while exercising powers vested under Section 13(1) of the Sindh Madressatul Islam University Karachi Act 2011, as amended by the Sindh Universities and Institutes Laws (Amendment) Act 2018. This decision followed a summary moved by the Chairman of the Sindh Higher Education Commission (HEC) Dr. Tariq Rafi. As per the rules, the HEC must submit a summary for the appointment of a vice chancellor for a second term six months before the completion of the current term.

The reappointment of Prof. Dr. Mujeebuddin Sahrai Memon was based on his performance at Sindh Madressatul Islam University from August 17, 2020, to the present. Dr. Sahrai was initially appointed as Vice Chancellor by the Chief Minister of Sindh on the recommendation of the Search Committee on August 13, 2020, and he joined SMIU on August 17, 2020.

During his first term, Dr. Sahrai achieved significant milestones, including increasing the university's own resource contribution from 17% (PKR 50 million, fiscal year 2018-19) to 49% (PKR 268.978 million, fiscal year 2021-22), with further growth to PKR 309.474 million in the fiscal year 2022-23. He also significantly reduced the budget deficit from PKR 66.739 million (fiscal year 2019-20) to PKR 6.055 million (fiscal year 2022-23), a decrease of 1056%. Additionally, a new grant of PKR 90 million was secured for SMIU Model School with the support of the Sindh Higher Education Commission, and the Government of Sindh.

Under Dr. Sahrai's leadership, SMIU made substantial progress. New facilities included a new I.T. Block, the establishment of the University Development Office (UDO), the Allama I.I. Kazi Library at the I.T. Tower, the Ibrahim Mullah Hi-Tech Lab at Talpur House, the National Incubation Center in collaboration with the Punjab I.T. Board at the I.T. Tower, a Youth Development Center near the I.T. Tower, and a new cafeteria near the Khan Bahadur Hassanally Effendi Library.

Additionally, during his first term, the student population increased from 1,841 to 5,510 (a 199% increase), eight PhD and MS programs were launched under NOC from HEC, 11 new BS programs were introduced, and two Global Research Congresses and 11 International Conferences were organized.

It is also worth noting that during Dr. Sahrai's first term, research projects totaling Rs 39 million were funded by HEC Pakistan. He signed 22 MoUs with national and international organizations/institutes/universities and achieved an international ranking for SMIU (in the 401 to 600 range) on SDG #13 (Climate Action) and SDG #17 (Partnership for the Goals).

The faculty, administrative staff, and other members of Sindh Madressatul Islam University have praised the decision to appoint Dr. Mujeebuddin Sahrai for a second term as Vice Chancellor. They believe that under his leadership, SMIU has emerged as a prominent institution for higher education in the country and that continuity in his visionary leadership is essential for further development and stability.

The faculty of SMIU hosted dinner at a local restaurant in the honour of Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Mujeebuddin Sahrai Memon. Deans, heads of academic departments, directors of administrative departments and faculty members attended the event.

Meetings, Visits & Events

SMIU Senate's 7th Meeting

The 7th Senate meeting of SMIU was held on Thursday, January 18, 2024, at the Senate Hall. The meeting was chaired by Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai on behalf of the Chief Minister of Sindh, who had authorized him to do so due to other engagements.

Following a detailed discussion, the Senate approved the minutes of the 6th Senate meeting and the actions taken based on its decisions. The Senate also passed resolutions on the annual budget estimated for the financial year 2023-24, the revised budget for the financial year 2022-23, and the annual statement of accounts for the financial year 2022-23 concerning non-development recurring resources. Additionally, a resolution was passed regarding the annual statement of accounts related to the development projects of the university for the financial year





2022-23, including the expansion of SMIU's city campus and the development of SMIU's Malir Campus in the education city.

During the meeting, Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai stated that SMIU had moved beyond deficit and was now stable in many respects, focusing fully on quality education, research, and development projects. He noted that in today's competitive world, universities must achieve financial stability by generating their own income resources, and SMIU is already working toward this goal.

Dr. Sahrai highlighted that a high-tech lab for researchers had been established at SMIU with a donation of 11 million rupees from alumnus Dr. Ibrahim Mulla. He also mentioned that seven research journals, recognized by the Higher Education Commission of Pakistan (HEC), are being published. Dr. Sahrai informed the Senate that SMIU had established another library at the I.T. Tower, named after alumnus Allama I.I. Kazi, to cater to the needs of students in the Faculty of Information Technology.

He further informed the Senate that SMIU is developing a



ten-year plan to outline its future direction. A committee comprising two SMIU faculty members, Mr. Asif Hussain Samo, Assistant Professor, and Ms. Quratulain Nazir, Assistant Professor, is working on this plan in consultation with Dr. Tauha Hussain Ali, Vice Chancellor of Mehran University of Engineering



and Technology, Jamshoro.

The Vice Chancellor commended the outgoing Senate members for their contributions to the betterment of SMIU and welcomed the new members. The Senate members appreciated Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai's efforts for SMIU's development over the past three and a half years.

Sindh Madressatul Islam University owned a 10-acre plot of land at Hawksbay, which had been allocated by the Government of Sindh to it. On January 19, 2024, the Vice Chancellor of the university, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, along with other officials, visited the plot. The site is situated near Hawksbay Scheme 42, Benazir Town, and Sahafi Colony.

At the site, the Vice Chancellor issued directives to the concerned officials of the Department of Works and Services to immediately construct a boundary wall around the plot. Dr. Mujeeb



Sahrai stated that the SMIU Hawksbay campus would be established there, aiming to provide modern and quality education for the students in the area.

Dr. Sahrai addresses International Conference



SMIU and Evolution Sign MoU for U.S. Government-funded Access Program

Dr. Mujeebuddin Sahrai Memon, Vice Chancellor of SMIU, and Ms. Sidrah Niaz, Chief Executive Officer of Evolution, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on April 30, 2024 at a ceremony held in the Conference Room of SMIU. Mr. Wafa Mansoor Buriro, the focal person from SMIU for the event, signed the MoU as a witness.

The ceremony was also attended by Ms. Anastasia Kolivas, Public Diplomacy Officer from the U.S. Consulate General in Karachi, and Ms. Aisha Zeeshan, English Programs Manager from the same consulate. Additional attendees included Prof. Dr. Tariq Rafi, Chairman of Sindh Higher Education Commission; Prof. Dr. Jamshed Adil Halepoto, Dean of SMIU; Prof. Dr. Fateh Marri, Vice Chancellor of Sindh Agriculture University, Tandojam &



Umerkot; Dr. Arabella Bhutto, Vice Chancellor of the University of Sufism and Modern Sciences, Bhitshah; and Momal Raza, Lecturer at the University of Sufism and Modern Sciences, Bhitshah.

According to the MoU, 150 bright and economically disadvantaged students from SMIU Model School (75 boys and 75 girls, aged 13-16 and enrolled in grades 7, 8, or 9) will receive English language instruction under the English Access Scholarship Program, funded by the Regional English Language Office (RELO) through the U.S. Mission in Pakistan.

The MoU was set to commence on May 5, 2024, and continue through February 28, 2026. Access classes were



expected to start in June 2024, held three times a week (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday) at SMIU Model School. In addition to English language instruction, the program aimed to develop students' digital literacy skills and personal development by fostering balanced



intellectual and emotional capabilities to better prepare them for future academic and professional endeavors.

Under the MoU, the program was to hire four qualified teachers, each responsible for a class of 25 students, and one academic coordinator. The program would provide periodic training on the Access curriculum to ensure effective teaching methods, as well as course materials and additional resources to support students and teachers. The MoU stated that students would receive a daily transport allowance of Rs. 135 (subject to fluctuation due to the dollar rate) to facilitate their attendance.

Additionally, the program planned to organize outdoor events, including opening and closing ceremonies, field trips, service-learning projects, UN/U.S. celebrations, and professional development sessions to enhance the student experience.

Before signing the MoU, Dr. Mujeebuddin Sahrai Memon, Vice Chancellor of SMIU, welcomed the guests and appreciated the efforts of the U.S. Consulate General in Karachi for their contributions to education in Pakistan. Dr. Sahrai thanked Ms. Anastasia Kolivas, Ms. Aisha Zeeshan, Ms. Sidrah Niaz, and other dignitaries for their presence at the ceremony. He highlighted the past and present developments of SMIU and expressed his desire for continued cooperation between U.S. Consulate General-sponsored programs and SMIU.

Ms. Anastasia Kolivas praised the Sindh HEC for their openness and commitment to implementing the Access program at universities in Karachi, Umerkot, and Bhitshah. She discussed various U.S. government-funded opportunities for potential future collaborations aimed at enhancing the higher education sector in Sindh.

Prof. Dr. Tariq Rafi, Chairman of Sindh HEC, appreciated the linkages between the U.S. Consulate General and higher education institutions (HEIs) in Sindh. He emphasized the necessity of programs like Access for the capacity building of students and stressed the need for more in-depth and extended



linkages between the U.S. Embassy/ Consulate and HEIs in Sindh.

Ms. Aisha Zeeshan briefed the dignitaries on U.S. government-funded English programs and their impact on the lives of underprivileged youth by empowering them with English language skills. She mentioned that teachers had been well-trained throughout















the RELO program and expressed gratitude to the Sindh HEC Chairman, SMIU's Vice Chancellor, and all other vice chancellors present. She pledged continued collaboration in the future.

At the SMIU stall, Dr. Sahrai and Dr. Marri praised the research work of the students and encouraged them to continue their interest in research-based activities.



SMIU to Organize International Conference on Environment

Sindh Madressatul Islam University held its 5th Convocation on May 29, 2024, at the Pearl Continental Hotel, Karachi. The Governor emphasized that the graduates should serve and support their parents, who have made significant contributions to their growth and education through hard work. "Even today, while




























Mr. Kamran Tessori announced his intention to donate an IT lab to his alma mater, SMIU, funded personally.

In his speech, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, Vice Chancellor of SMIU, emphasized that for the human development of Pakistan, the youth must avail themselves



Professor Emeritus at Washington State University (WSU) Dr. Mushtaq Memon delivered a lecture on "Fulbright Scholarship & Fellowship Opportunities for Students, Post-Doctorates, and Faculty Members in the United States" at the Senate Hall of SMIU on Monday, January 29, 2024. The lecture was organized by the Office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization (ORIC).

In his lecture, Dr. Mushtaq Memon mentioned that Pakistan was the largest beneficiary of the Fulbright programs in the world, annually sending 200 faculty members, post-doctorates, PhD students, and others to the USA.

Dr. Memon, a Fulbright specialist with 35 years of teaching experience in the USA, explained that the Fulbright Scholar Program is the largest scholar exchange program in the world. It was started in 1946, just after the end of World War II, by the late US Senator William Fulbright.

"Due to the destruction caused by WWII, Senator William Fulbright thought to bring the world closer together, and he started this program with the help of the US government by selling leftover ammunition from WWII," Dr. Mushtaq Memon said. He added that students, faculty, and administrative staff of Pakistan can benefit from these multiple academic exchange programs offered by the USA for both long-term and shortterm periods.

He further mentioned that 800 US scholars are working in 150 countries for Fulbright and other related academic exchange programs. Similarly, 1,200 scholars come to the USA under the Fulbright Scholar programs. Additionally, Fulbright Commissions operate in 50 countries, helping people who want to study in the USA.

Dr. Memon stated that it is a golden opportunity and a privilege for Pakistan's students, faculty, and administrative staff, especially women and aspiring individuals from rural areas, to study in the USA. He noted that the United States Educational Foundation in Pakistan is also helping Pakistani students and faculty members avail themselves of these opportunities. He suggested that university faculty members should prepare their students for Fulbright Scholar Exchange Programs so that students can qualify for them on merit.

He proposed that SMIU establish a research center in collaboration with the USA to prepare students for Fulbright of the Fulbright Scholar Exchange Programs and, after completing their education abroad, must return to their country because they have a bond with this land. He stressed the need to develop a research culture and expand collaboration with research institutions in the USA and other countries in this digital age.



The Vice Chancellor noted that although Dr. Mushtaq Memon is a US citizen, he is a son of the soil and has never disconnected himself from his own country, Pakistan. Dr. Sahrai mentioned that whenever Dr. Memon visits Pakistan, he travels to various parts, especially Sindh, where he shares information about Fulbright and other opportunities offered by US institutions with students and faculty.

Dr. Aamir Iqbal Umrani, Director of ORIC, warmly welcomed the guest and introduced him to the audience. Dr. Zahid Ali Channar, Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences, also spoke on the occasion. A Question-and-Answer session was held as well. In the end, Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai presented a shield to Dr. Mushtaq Memon.

She also introduced a third domain for Program Accreditation Reviewing Effectiveness of QA and Accreditation Bodies (REQAAB).

She described the background of the Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) for Higher Education and its policies, and she informed the participants about the upcoming review mechanism, judgment framework, challenges of effective implementation, and grant allocation for the institute's performance. Meanwhile, participants actively engaged in the session and discussed their observations.

At the end, Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai addressed the participants, urging them to submit their feedback and observations on the new QAA framework and to strive towards achieving quality work targets.

We brought deficit from 60 to 06 percent: Vice Chancellor



In an interview published in the Sindhi daily Sobh, Karachi recently Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, Vice Chancellor of Sindh Madressatul Islam University, announced that the first PhD degree from SMIU would be awarded in the coming months.

In response to a question from the newspaper's reporter, Mr. Waheed Memon, Dr. Sahrai stated that preparations for the 3rd Global Research Congress had begun. This time, very important and selected universities from around the world would be invited to participate in this major research event.



Dr. Sahrai further commented that it was a commendable decision by the Federal Government of Pakistan to allocate 65 billion rupees as a grant for public sector universities in the new budget for 2024-25. He expressed hope that such grants would resolve some of the problems faced by public sector universities.

In response to another question, Dr. Sahrai mentioned that the deficit of SMIU had been reduced from 60 percent to 6 percent during his tenure. He also noted that, previously, SMIU had been covering all expenses for SMIU Model School from its budget. However, a separate budget of 90 million rupees for SMIU Model School had been secured from the Government of Sindh, with support from Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah and Education Minister Syed Sardar Ali Shah.

Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai pledged to make Sindh Madressatul Islam University one of the leading universities in both the country and the world. ■

Renowned Environmental Journalist Sheema Siddiqui talks on Environmental Threats





The Department of Environmental Sciences, in collaboration with the Directorate of Students' Affairs and Counseling at SMIU, organized a session on the hazards of plastic and environmental challenges on April 30, 2024, at the Senate Hall of SMIU. The session was connected with Earth Day, observed on April 22 worldwide. Noted environmental journalist Ms. Sheema Siddiqui was the keynote speaker.

In her presentation, she stated that sea levels are rising daily, threatening the existence of coastal areas and cities like Karachi and Dhaka. She noted that soil erosion by the sea poses a significant threat to agricultural lands and human lives, with the Indus Delta particularly affected. She emphasized the need for sustainable environmental practices. Citing references from global organizations, she mentioned that 3.3 million tons of plastic waste enter the seas annually. As a result, by 2050, there might be no fish in the oceans, only plastic.

Ms. Siddiqui further highlighted that plastic utensils pose a significant threat to human and marine life, advocating for

the use of steel and clay utensils instead. "The use of plastic utensils in food leads to diseases like cancer and tuberculosis (T.B.), with cancer cases notably increasing in our country," she said, adding that plastic particles mix with our food when using plastic plates and bowls, harming our health. She pointed out that this situation affects other South Asian countries as well.

She observed that climate change, particularly after Covid-19, has disrupted the four seasons, with cold weather continuing until April and no visible spring this year. She noted that early rains in the country indicate climate change. Unlike in the past, in 2024, parts of Sindh, Punjab, and other areas experienced rains in April. "Recently, snowfall was observed in Chitral, affecting wheat and other crops," she noted.

Ms. Siddiqui mentioned that environmental changes have altered the ecosystem and the natural lifestyle in rural areas. "We have deviated from nature and are acting against it," she said, commenting on the widespread use of chemical fertilizers in agriculture, which also creates health and environmental problems.

She pointed out that heavy floods, particularly in Sindh province, have caused significant damage to food security. She suggested returning to environmentally friendly practices and abandoning the use of plastic utensils that harm our lives. "If we want to save the Earth and human lives, we must promote environmental awareness among the masses," she concluded.

Earlier, Dr. Hina Shehnaz, Incharge Chairperson of the Department of Environmental Sciences, welcomed the guest. Mr. Khalid Hassan, Lecturer in the Department of Environmental Science, SMIU, conducted the proceedings. A large number of students and faculty members attended the seminar.

He asserted that the purpose of business is to create value for all stakeholders, including investors. Additionally, he stressed that while making money is important, it should not be the sole objective of business.

Dr. Menghwar highlighted that



trepreneurs would undermine the power of the elite. He pointed out that, despite having high-quality education and social awareness, the British monarchy remains intact, with the royal family's net worth estimated at \$28 billion. Similarly, the Dutch Royal Family has a net worth of \$1.3 billion.

Dr. Menghwar acknowledged that business firms and corporations do maximize their profits but also address social issues. He cited the example of Bombay Bakery in Hyderabad, which has thrived for a long time due to its commitment to product quality. He urged the students of the Department of Business Administration to engage in business while uphold-

Session on Special Children



The Department of Media and Communication Studies at SMIU organized an interactive session on "Children with Inclusive Needs" at the uniauditorium versity's on June 6, 2024. The session was presided over by Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, with noted philanthropist and Chairman of



the Edhi Foundation, Mr. Faisal Edhi, serving as the chief guest. During the event, final-year students from the department presented video reports and short films on the daily lives, activities, and challenges faced by special persons as part of their final-year projects.

In his address, Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai noted that special persons constitute about 16 percent (more than 1 billion) of the world's population. He highlighted that there are 15 million special persons in Pakistan and stressed that society must treat them as valued individuals, ensuring that necessary facilities are provided in buildings and public transport.

Dr. Sahrai emphasized that for the country's development, all marginalized communities, including women and special persons, must be included in every field. He mentioned that Sindh Madressatul Islam University had incorporated facilities for special persons in its buildings being constructed on the Malir campus.

Dr. Sahrai welcomed Mr. Faisal Edhi, the son of the distinguished philanthropist Mr. Abdul Sattar Edhi and chairman of the Edhi Foundation, to Sindh Madressatul Islam University. At the Vice Chancellor's suggestion, the audience gave a standing ovation to honor the great services of Abdul Sattar Edhi. Dr. Sahrai remarked, "There were few individuals in the world who had no controversy, and Mr. Abdul Sattar Edhi was one of them," and he commended Mr. Faisal Edhi for continuing his father's noble mission. The Vice Chancellor offered his support for any future needs related to humanitarian service.

Dr. Sahrai also praised the video reports prepared by the students of the Department of Media and Communication Studies, noting that they had fulfilled their social responsibility.

In his address, Mr. Faisal Edhi stated that those special persons engaged in small businesses are the real heroes and deserve support. He emphasized that these individuals strive for a better life and wish to contribute to society, thus requiring our support.

Mr. Edhi highlighted that Karachi had 2 million children enrolled in primary schools, while 2.6 million children were out of school. He called for efforts to provide education to all children in the country.

He shared an anecdote about meeting a Palestinian diplomat in Islamabad a few years' prior, requesting permission to start work for children in Gaza. The diplomat had responded that while Egypt could grant such permission, despite the war







imposed by Israel at that time, Gaza had a literacy rate of over 98 percent and was operating three shifts of schools due to a shortage of buildings. Mr. Edhi argued that, given there is no war-like situation in Pakistan, efforts should be made to educate all children, and if necessary, schools should operate in multiple shifts like in Gaza.

Mr. Edhi noted that there are currently no "nuns" in Karachi, who were mainly from Christian and Hindu communities.

This lack of support affects many children's homes in Karachi, such as Darulsukun. He also pointed out that decreased financial support from European countries due to their engagement in wars has created a crisis for welfare organizations.

He stressed the need for a skilled Pakistan where both normal and special children receive vocational training. Mr. Edhi appreciated Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai and the students of the Department of Media and Communication Studies for organizing such an important session.

Special persons including Saba Ghizali, Gold Medalist, PhD Scholar, and visiting faculty at SMIU; Syed Ali Hassan, Sub Editor of Monthly Qaumi Zaban, Anjuman-i-Taraqqi-i-Urdu; Preeti Varodra, receptionist at TDF Magnificence Centre; and Ali Khan Tareen, Co-CEO and Founder of Khas Foodz, shared their success stories. They suggested that the government should provide facilities in workplaces and public places for special persons. Savio M. Pereira, CEO of Darulsukun Welfare Society, also spoke about the needs and problems faced by special persons. At the end of the event, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai presented shields to the guests.

It was a grand event that was attended by a large number of scholars, researchers, and academicians from all parts of the country and abroad. During the two days of the congress, SMIU looked like a research festival as all its historic buildings were decorated with panaflexes and other decorative items.

The SMIU faculty, under the guidance of Vice Chancellor

Before the commencement of the Congress, a briefing was held for CEC members and heads of departments by Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai to review and finalize the arrangements. A brief report on the briefing and other proceedings of the Congress and International Conferences are provided below:

Briefing by Honourable Vice Chancellor About 2nd GRC 2024



A briefing session about the 2nd GRC was held on February 26, 2024, at the Senate Hall of the university, which was chaired by the Vice Chancellor of SMIU, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai. It was attended by the Central Executive Committee's (CEC) Convener, Dr. Zahid Ali Channar, and members, including Dr. Aftab Ahmed Shaikh, Dean Faculty of Information Technology, Dr. Jamshed Adil Halepoto, Dean Faculty of Management, Business Administration, and Commerce, Dr. Abdul Hafeez

Khan, Advisor to the Vice Chancellor on Academic Affairs, Dr. Aamir Iqbal Umrani (who was also Secretary of the CEC), Mr. Ghulam Mustafa Shaikh, Registrar, Mr. Asif Hussain Samo, Assistant Professor, Ms. Quratulain Nazeer, Assistant Professor, Syed Azeem Imam, Assistant Professor, Mr. Nisar Ahmed Memon, Additional Director Finance, Mr. Abdul Waheed Jatoi, Additional Director I.T., Anwar Ali Abro, Director PR Department, and Asif Ghafar, Director Broadcasting and Media Training.

Among other participants of the briefing were chairpersons of different academic departments of the varsity, including Dr. Mansoor Ahmed Khuhro, Dr. Subhash Babu, Dr. Riaz



Ahmed Mangrio, Dr. Stephen John, Dr. Hina Shahzad, Director of Finance Mr. Ghulam Ali Surhio, Director of I.T. Dr. Shah Mohammad Butt, Director of Works and Services Mr. Shairan, Director of the Library Mr. Shahnawaz Mahessar, Incharge of Transport Mr. Ghulam Ali Ramejo, and other officials. Dr. Aamir Iqbal Umrani, Secretary of the 2nd SMIU GRC, conducted the proceedings.

During the briefing session, the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, announced the final arrangements for the Congress. It was stated that the inaugural session of the Congress would be held on Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. at the Sir Shahnawaz Bhutto Auditorium, while the six international conferences, organized by the six faculties of the university, would be inaugurated at different venues.

The Vice Chancellor, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, while addressing the session, said that SMIU was going to organize a unique global research congress along with six international conferences on different subjects from Wednesday, February 28, 2024.

He stated that there would be a strong presence of distinguished scholars from home and abroad, and hence the 2ndGRC would be more successful than the previous year's GRC. Dr. Sahrai mentioned that SMIU had set high standards by organizing the Global Research Congress, which would ultimately promote research work in the country. "Since 2020, when I assumed the vice-chancellorship of SMIU, I have prioritized research work and preferred to utilize the available resources of the university for this cause. Thus, we discovered the magic of the historic buildings of SMIU and carried out all activities here smoothly. The GRC is also being held within the premises of SMIU," he added.

Providing details of the 2nd SMIU GRC, its Convener, Dr. Zahid Ali Channar, said that six prominent research scholars from abroad and six from the country's provinces were attending the Congress. Among the scholars are Prof. Dr. Keith Barton, Professor at Indiana University, USA; Ms. Shajara Ul-Durar, Associate Professor at the University of Sunderland, United Kingdom; Dr. Solnyshkina Marina Ivanovna, Professor at Kazan Federal University, Russia; Dr. Ridwan Adetunji Raji of Zayed University, Abu Dhabi, UAE; Dr. Norsiah Abdul Hamid, Associate Professor at University Utara Malaysia (UUM); Dr. Mohd Sobhi Ishak, Associate Professor at the University Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM); Prof. Dr. Jürgen Hescheler, renowned German physician and researcher; Dr. Shuo Yu, Associate Professor at Dalian University of Technology; Prof. Dr. Nadeem Ul Haque, Vice Chancellor of the Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, Islamabad; Dr. Jawad Syed of Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS); Prof. Dr. Wasima Shehzad, Acting Dean and Professor at Air University, Islamabad; Dr. Nadeem Javaid of COMSATS University, Islamabad; Dr. Shahida Sajjad, Vice Chancellor of Metropolitan University; Prof. Dr. Muhammad Aslam Uqaili, Pro-Vice Chancellor of Mehran University, Jamshoro; Prof. Dr. Riaz



Ahmed Shaikh, Dean Faculty of Education and Social Sciences, SZABIST, Karachi; Ms. Ambar Shamsi, Director CEJ, IBA, Karachi; senior journalist Mr. Sohail Sangi; Shahzeb Jillani, noted columnist; Dr. Tauseef Ahmed Khan and other speakers are expected to participate in different sessions of the Congress and international conferences.

Dr. Channar further informed that 49 panelists from different fields were participating in nine panel discussion sessions, while there would be 140 technical sessions across the six international conferences organized by different faculties of the university. Thus, around 1,000 research scholars are participating in the two-day Congress. He also mentioned that 30 research scholars would chair different sessions, and similarly, there would be 30 co-chairs. Some online sessions are also scheduled.

The Convener said the technical sessions of the international conferences would be held simultaneously at 19 venues across the three buildings of SMIU, including the Main Building, Talpur House, and I.T. Tower. Different committees were also formed to execute the assigned duties during the two days of the 2nd SMIU GRC. ■











DAY ONE

Inauguration Ceremony of 2nd Global Research Congress



The mega event of the 2nd Global Research Congress and six international conferences began with an inaugural session on Wednesday, February 28, 2024, at 10:30 a.m. at the Sir Shahnawaz Bhutto Auditorium. The auditorium was filled with national and international scholars, academicians, officers, students, distinguished personalities, and media personnel. The event commenced with the recitation of the Holy Quran, followed by the playing of the National Anthem, which all participants stood to honor.

Following this, the formal proceedings commenced. Assistant Professor of SMIU and member of the Central Executive Committee of the GRC-24, Ms.



Quratulain Nazir Ahmed, who played a significant role in organizing the Congress alongside other CEC members and administrative staff, conducted the session.

The Vice Chancellor, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, Consul General of China Yang Yundong, Consul General of Turkiye Cemal Sangu, Secretary of Universities and Boards Noor Ahmed Samo, Russian scholar Dr. Solnyshkina Marian Ivanovna, American scholar Prof. Dr. Keith, UK Scholar Dr. Shajara Ul Durar, and others inaugurated the 2nd SMIU Global Research Congress by lighting a globe.

Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, Vice Chancellor of SMIU and host of the 2nd GRC, then delivered a welcome address, expressing his appreciation to the guests who traveled from Russia, the USA, the UK, Vietnam,





the UAE, and various parts of Pakistan to participate in the Congress.

In his speech, Dr. Sahrai mentioned that the idea of holding the Global Research Congress originated from the young and dynamic faculty of SMIU, who envisioned organizing a Congress with five international conferences last year. Believing in the confidence, innovative ideas, and spirit of youth, they successfully organized the 1st Global Research Congress in 2023. This second edition of the GRC attracted even more scholars from across Pakistan and abroad compared to the previous congress.

Dr. Sahrai emphasized that the Global Research Congress is a hallmark of Sindh Madressatul Islam University in Pakistan, which would yield beneficial outcomes for the nation, the country, and the global community. He also highlighted that SMIU is advancing in research, publishing six research journals recognized by the HEC Pakistan. Additionally, the university's research output by faculty has significantly increased. As a researcher and academic himself, Dr. Sahrai expressed hope that the conference would produce tangible outcomes, especially as it also included six international conferences, with findings to be shared with stakeholders both nationally and internationally.

Subsequently, Chairman of the Higher

Education Commission of Pakistan, Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed, delivered his speech online. He congratulated Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai and his team for organizing the highly valuable Global Research Congress and expressed his honor and delight in participating.

Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed emphasized the importance of the Congress, noting that the participation of Consul Generals from China and Turkiye, along with other international speakers, underscores the need to find collective solutions to the challenges facing humanity. He remarked that this Congress represents a significant milestone in the life and history of SMIU, providing opportunities for learners, researchers, faculty, and students. He added that participants from different regions and countries could learn from each other's experiences, knowledge, and research. Furthermore, the Congress would

establish a network among participating scholars to collaborate in the future.

The HEC Chairman expressed hope that the Congress would conclude with a roadmap for future collaboration in various areas and advised Dr. Sahrai to share the Congress's roadmap and findings with HEC so that a strategy for developing higher education and society could be formulated.

In his speech, the Consul General of China in Karachi, Mr. Yang Yundong, highlighted the strong brotherly relations









between Pakistan and China. He noted that in 2017, China's first university launched the Pakistan-China Corridor, and today, 16 Chinese universities are affiliated with Pakistani universities, some of which even offer Urdu language courses. He added that China is collaborating with Pakistan in many areas, including global warming, and that the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) is a comprehensive plan for enhancing relations between the two countries, which continues to improve.

The Consul General of Turkiye in Karachi, Mr. Cemal Sangu, spoke of the historic and emotional connection between Turkiye and Sindh Madressatul Islam, noting that Sultan Abdul Hameed of the Ottoman Empire awarded the founder of Sindh Madressatul Islam, Hassanally Effendi, with two of Turkiye's highest civil titles, "Bey" and "Effendi," in recognition of his contributions to modern education in Sindh and his support for Turkiye in its war with Russia. He announced that the Turkish Consulate in Karachi would soon build a mausoleum for Hassanally Effendi in Hyderabad, Sindh. Mr. Sangu also remarked that the Global Research Congress would play a significant role in promoting research in Pakistan and other









countries.

Mr. Noor Ahmed Samo, Secretary of Universities and Boards, Government of Sindh, in his speech, stated that the Global Research Congress was unique in its theme and would undoubtedly provide actionable recommendations to the Government of Sindh for implementation. He congratulated the Vice Chancellor and faculty of SMIU for organizing such a significant event, and as a representative of the Sindh Government, he emphasized that Sindh is the only province in Pakistan that recognizes the value of higher education more than other provinces.

The Secretary mentioned that the Sindh provincial government allocated 23 billion rupees in grants for 29 public sector universities and approximately 12 billion rupees for their development schemes, in contrast to the Punjab government's allocation of only 5 billion rupees for its universities.

The memorable session concluded with the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, presenting souvenirs to the guests.

At the International Conference organized by the Faculty of Culture, Dr. Solnyshkina Marina Ivanovna, Professor of Linguistics at Kazan Federal University, Russia, spoke about text complexity, while Dr. Wasima Shahzad, Professor of Linguistics at Air University, Islamabad, discussed corpus linguistics.

During the two-day International Conference organized by the Department of English, 10 parallel sessions were held each day, where nearly 40 research papers were presented. The sessions were chaired by esteemed international and national scholars.







Panel discussion on 'Sustainable Energy Narratives and Local Communities in Sindh'



The Faculty of Social Sciences organized a panel discussion on "Sustainable Energy Narratives and Local Communities in Sindh" on Wednesday, February 28, at the Senate Hall of SMIU. Mr. Sohail Sangi, Senior Journalist and Faculty Member at the Federal Urdu University, Karachi; Ms. Mehwish, Program Manager at the Policy Research Institute for Equitable Development (PRIED); and Mr. Yasir Darya of the Climate Action Centre were among the panelists. The session was moderated by Ms. Zeenia Shaukat, Director of The Knowledge Forum, Karachi.









The speakers highlighted the plight of local communities affected by development projects, noting that these communities often suffered more than they benefited from such initiatives. Using the example



of Thar, they pointed out that local communities had not been granted their right-ful entitlements and were even deprived of clean drinking water by the authorities. They added that similar situations existed in other parts of the province. The panelists suggested that the government should prioritize the welfare of local communities when initiating development projects.

Dr. Zahid Ali Channar, Convener of the GRC, and Dr. Sana Shahid, Assistant Professor at SMIU, also shared their views. At the conclusion of the session, Dr. Zahid Ali Channar presented shields to the guests.

Panel Discussion on Integrating Sustainable Across Teacher Curricula: Challenges, **Opportunities and Practices**



This session was organized by the Faculty of Education at SMIU on Wednesday, February 28. The panelists included Mr. Keith Casey Barton from the USA, Secretary of Education for the Government of Sindh Dr. Shireen Mustafa Narejo, Dr. Sajid Ali, Mrs. Salma, Dr. Abdul Sattar Almani, Dr. Hina Kazmi, Dr. Anjum Bano, and Dr. Shahida Sajid. Mr. Hassan Raza moderated the session.

The panelists stressed that teachers must be well-versed in the curriculum and modern sciences to educate and train students effectively. They suggested that the Sindh government should foster public-private partnerships in the education and health sectors to enhance public services. They argued that without the cooperation of the private sector, it would be challenging to provide modern facilities in these areas. Additionally, they pointed









out that the existence of separate curricula in private and public sector educational institutions in Sindh creates feelings of inferiority or superiority among students, which negatively impacts their lives and society as a whole.

The session concluded with a question-and-answer segment. In the end Dr. Zahid Ali Channar, Convener of the GRC presented shields to the participants of the panel discussion.

During the discussion, Dr. Shireen Mustafa Narejo emphasized that to advance society in the right direction, there is a need for better teacher training alongside the development of a modern curriculum.

Other panelists expressed the view that the educational curriculum must be aligned with contemporary needs. They also noted that educated parents are essential for the proper upbringing of children, but unfortunately, the required number of educated parents is still lacking in rural areas.

The panelists commended the evolution of English departments across universities in Sindh and discussed the paradigm shift from exonormative tendencies to endonormative approaches in linguistic research. They emphasized the importance of preserving indigenous



languages and cultures while cautioning against neglecting the global significance of the English language.

Bachelor's and Master's students from the department also engaged with the esteemed panelists during the question-and-answer session. On this occasion Dr. Riaz Ahmed Mangrio, Incharge Chairperson of the English Department presented souvenirs to the participants of the panel discussion.



Panel Discussion on

'Population Challenges and Social Inclusion: Role of Media in Shaping Peaceful and Smart Communities'











The Faculty of Social Sciences organized a panel discussion on "Population Challenges and Social Inclusion: Role of Media in Shaping Peaceful and Smart Communities" on Thursday, February 29.

Prominent academicians and media professionals were among the panelists. They expressed the view that society must control population growth, as our limited resources cannot meet the needs of an expanding population. What is considered a blessing can easily turn into a curse.

Dr. Tauseef Ahmed Khan, former Chairman of the Department of Mass Communication at Federal Urdu University, Karachi, and a noted columnist, stated that the media has played a pivotal role in transforming society and educating the public. He emphasized that the media could play a major role in spreading awareness about family planning



among the masses. He also noted that both traditional and social media have the potential to raise awareness about population issues, which are a core problem in our society.

Dr. Riaz Ahmed Shaikh, Dean of the Faculty of Education and Social Sciences at SZABIST, Karachi, argued that we need to openly discuss population issues and family planning to create a sustainable society. Without addressing these issues, we cannot control the problems that arise from unchecked population growth. He pointed out that the lack of direction in population control is a significant reason why we face multiple problems.

Senior journalist Shahzeb Jillani ob-

served that family planning has not been taken seriously as a major social issue. He remarked that in our society, male members typically have the final say in deciding how many children to have, while women are often denied the right to make decisions about family planning. He also noted that even within the elite class in cities, there is a reluctance to discuss family planning, making it even more challenging to address these issues in rural areas. "Even female doctors are hesitant to guide people about family planning," Jillani said, adding that women in the country must be empowered to make their own decisions. He stressed that there are many societal taboos that must be overcome.

Prof. Dr. Muhammad Ismail Kumbhar, a noted intellectual and Professor at Sindh Agriculture University, Tandojam, pointed out that our livelihood resources, such as agriculture and fisheries, have not increased, while the population continues to grow rapidly. He mentioned that we lack accurate data on the population and informal labor, including peasants, domestic workers, and other



daily wage earners. He also highlighted that 80 percent of our groundwater is not drinkable, leading to widespread health problems. Pollution and environmental issues are major concerns in our country, with many other problems arising as their byproducts.

The session concluded with a question-and-answer segment. It was moderated by Dr. Subhash Babu, Chairperson of the Department of Social and Development Studies at SMIU. In the and Dr. Zahid Ali Channar along with Dr. Subhash Babu presented shields to the guests.

jobs would become increasingly prevalent, highlighting the need to focus on this sector. They emphasized the necessity for further research in medicine, pointing out that while medicines are developed after extensive research, new bacteria, such as the coronavirus, continue to emerge, reducing the effectiveness of antibiotics.

The session concluded with a question-and-answer segment, which









The Faculty of Information Technology organized a panel discussion on "Artificial Intelligence: Future Trends in Research, Diagnosis, Ethical Considerations, and Job Market Implications" on Thursday, Feburary 29, at the university auditorium.

Distinguished experts in IT and artificial intelligence from Pakistan, including Dr. Mehtab Alam, Professor at the University of Karachi; Dr. Muhammad Hassan, Professor at JPMC; Dr. Imtiaz Hussain; Dr. Danish Jameel; and Dr. Nauman Ali Khan, shared their insights on various aspects of AI. The experts noted that AI technology essentially involves a form of facial recognition



that relies heavily on intuition. They observed that this knowledge was present among our ancestors. According to them, AI has exposed everything in the world, leaving no secrets hidden. Every action we take is recorded and transmitted to the cloud, where it is utilized. The experts predicted that data collection



was moderated by Dr. Imtiaz Hussain, Assistant Professor in the Department of Artificial Intelligence and Mathematical Sciences. In the end Dr. Aftab Ahmed Shaikh, Dean Faculty of Information Technology presented shields to the guests of the session. ■



Panel Discussion on 'Integrating Sustainability into Higher Education: Challenges and Opportunities from the Perspective of Academicians'



A highly significant session titled "Integrating Sustainability into Higher Education: Challenges and Opportunities from the Perspective of Academicians" was held on February 29 at the Sir Shahnawaz Bhutto Auditorium. Distinguished academicians from Pakistan, Russia, the USA, and the UK participated in the discussion. They expressed concerns about the decreasing natural resources and the increasing consumption of resources such as natural gas and water, and they also highlighted the alarming rate of population growth.

The panelists emphasized the urgent need for sustainability in development at all levels. They suggested that everyone should contribute to sustainability within their respective fields, both individually and collectively, and that sustainability should be incorporated into higher education curricula.

Dr. Muhammad Aslam Uqaili, former Vice Chancellor and current ProVice Chancellor of Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Jamshoro, stated that the natural resources we use are no longer sustainable and are being depleted at the expense of future generations. He pointed out that development comes with costs and that sustainability is often overlooked in developing countries. Dr. Uqaili noted that energy resources have been overused, leading to shortages even in Karachi, and highlighted that while there is a push for recycling, countries like Germany have achieved zero waste. He stressed the need for capacitybuilding training for youth to promote sustainability.

Dr. Manzoor Hussain Soomro of the ECO Science Foundation emphasized the importance of educating people about sustainability, the factors affecting the environment, and the skills and technologies required to achieve sustainability without focusing solely on SDGs and targets. He argued that education, including













SDGs 4 and 5, should be comprehensive and accessible to all. To meet these targets, he suggested starting with early childhood education, building upon it through tertiary educa-

tion, and then higher education. He proposed engaging the Higher Education Commission (HEC) to involve school children, university students, faculty, industry, media, and other stakeholders on a unified platform.







Dr. Keith Casey Barton, Professor at Indiana University, USA, mentioned that American universities centralize their efforts, and no one, including government officials or university leaders, can mandate specific goals. He viewed sustainability as a long and gradual process but emphasized its importance for ensuring a secure future.

Dr. Fateh Mohammad Marri. Vice Chancellor of Sindh Agriculture University, Tandojam, discussed food sustainability. He noted that while natural resources such as land, water, and forest reservoirs are limited, the population continues to grow, increasing the demand for food. He pointed out that changes in consumption patterns and urbanization exert significant pressure on natural resources. Dr. Marri stressed the need to meet current demands without compromising future needs or the interests of future generations. He also emphasized the importance of integrating sustainability into higher education and improving production and productivity. He highlighted that only about 3 percent of the eligible cohort accesses higher education, leaving 90 percent still outside it. He called for making education sustainable for all children.



Dr. Jawad Syed, Professor at the Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS), underscored the need for universities to reassess their priorities, as students are not responsible for these issues; rather, they are the products of the education system. He suggested evaluating key performance indicators (KPIs) to determine how many courses incorporate sustainability.

Ms. Shajara Ul Durar, Associate Professor at the University of Sunderland, UK, emphasized the need to empower students through projects and to hold educational leadership accountable. She noted that over 50 percent of students in UK universities are female, and efforts are ongoing to increase this number and address gender equality. She suggested that educational institutions should publish social impact reports and integrate them into academia.

Dr. Solnyshkina Marina Ivanovna, Professor of Linguistics at Kazan University, Russia, shared her success story and discussed the social and educational conditions during the Soviet Union era and in the present day. She explained how she received education in German and then English, which broadened her perspective. She noted that Russian edu-





cational institutions offer mixed courses and emphasized the need to contribute to society and sustainability without gender discrimination. She highlighted that Russia, rich in natural resources, has achieved sustainability in various areas.

Dr. Jamshed Adil Halepoto, Dean of the Faculty of Management, Business Administration, and Commerce at SMIU, moderated the session.









The session was attended by Dr. Tariq Rafi, Chairman of the Sindh HEC; Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, Vice Chancellor of SMIU; national and international scholars; SMIU faculty; heads of various academic and administrative departments; and students. At the end of the session, Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai presented souvenirs to the guests. ■



The Faculty of Management, Business Administration, and Commerce organized a special session with Prof. Dr. Jawad Syed of Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS) on "Biomimetic Innovation and Entrepreneurship" during the 2nd GRC-2024.

In his talk, Dr. Jawad Syed explained that we could enhance our lives and businesses by learning from the environment and natural systems around us. He suggested that this approach could significantly reduce energy expenditures and provide high-quality, cost-effective services and products to customers.

He further noted that while architects in European countries have begun con-

structing buildings in harmony with nature, this environmentally friendly trend has not gained much traction in our country. Dr. Syed provided the example of Japan, where the design of high-speed bul-

let trains was inspired by the kingfisher bird. By modifying the train's design based on this inspiration, Japan increased the train's speed by 20% and reduced the noise generated during acceleration.

Dr. Syed also discussed research on biomimetic and nature-friendly innovations, citing the example of termite mounds in forests. He explained that these mounds allow fresh air to circulate, which is essential for the termites' survival. This natural ventilation method has inspired architects worldwide to design buildings that mimic this model. Such buildings maintain lower temperatures, protect against extreme heat, and reduce the need

for air conditioning, thereby decreasing environmental pollution.

Dr. Syed opined that many countries are adopting nature-friendly ideas to improve current living conditions and create a sustainable environment for future generations. He emphasized the importance of learning from these models to advance our country and improve the lives of ordinary people.

On this occasion, Mr. Zaki Rashidi of Iqra University Karachi emphasized the need to return to environmentally friendly practices and reconnect with nature.

Dean of the Faculty of Management, Business Administration, and Commerce, Dr. Jamshed Adil Halepoto, thanked the participants for their contributions and for sharing their valuable insights with the faculty and students of SMIU.

Ms. Quratulain Nazeer, Assistant Professor at SMIU, delivered the vote of thanks, while Mr. Asif Hussain Samo, Assistant Professor at SMIU, conducted the session.



Vice Chancellor Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai invited the members of Central Executive Committee at stage and introduced them with the audience. He praised their role in organising the 2^{nd} Global Research Congress along with the secretaries of the international conferences. The Vice Chancellor also praised the role of officers of SMIU and other employees who worked with great dedication to accomplish their assignments. Addressing the session, the speakers said research was not just a paper work but it played a role of backbone for sustainable development of the society.

Academic Librarianship Trends in the 21st Century

This session was chaired by Dr. Mahboob Ali Dahraj. The speakers highlighted the importance of libraries and no society can ignore importance of libraries. They were of the opinion that the power of information and knowledge helped people to move forward. They said nations that were far from libraries could not climb the ladder of sustainable development. Dr. Danish moderated the program.

The role of leadership and management during turmoil

The session was chaired by Dr. Amir Manzoor, with Dr. Adnan Khurshid serving as the co-chair. Addressing the session, the speakers highlighted that the war situation affecting domestic and working women reflects their mental health status. They explained that women manage both homes and institutions, and it is natural for them to express frustration if they experience fatigue and other problems.

Finance

This is session was chaired by Dr. Irfan Haider Shakri and Dr. Sarah Wali Qazi was co-chair and Shafiq Ahmed hosted it. The speakers said experiences and knowledge reduce financial risk of people. They were of the view that improving finances requires better future planning.

Recommendations of the 2nd Global Research Congress and Six International Conferences

During the concluding ceremony of the 2nd Global Research Conference and its six international conferences organized by Sindh Madressatul Islam University, recommendations were presented to policymakers for implementation. The ceremony was attended by Chairman of Sindh HEC Dr. Tariq Rafi, Vice Chancellor of SMIU Dr. Mujeeb Sahrai, vice chancellors of various universities, national and international scholars, faculty, heads of different sections, and students.

Dr. Zahid Ali Channar, convener of the congress and international conferences, presented the following recommendations during the concluding session:

- Department of Environment: It was recommended that higher education institutions establish a Nature-Inspired Innovation Hub as a collaborative space where academia, industry experts, and the global community can engage in practices, discuss, and develop sustainable solutions inspired by nature. There is also a need for projects and research on nature-inspired smart communities, with findings shared with global research and academic communities through open educational practices.
- Department of Education: It emphasized the importance of cultivating interdisciplinary dialogues among educators, researchers, and policymakers on policy and curriculum issues in teacher education to shape a sustainable future. It was further recommended that teachers work closely with learners and conduct field analyses before designing courses. Collaboration between educators, industry experts, and students should be fostered to ensure relevance, adaptability, and a commitment to sustainable educational practices. Integrating mental health education into various disciplines was also highlighted as crucial for creating an inclusive and empathetic learning environment.
- Department of Media and Communication Studies: It was suggested that media personnel receive training to report ethically on human rights, justice, and social issues. Media professionals should work collaboratively with authorities to provide accurate information and use various media platforms to educate communities on safety and awareness.

The establishment of research centers dedicated to conducting studies, providing policy recommendations, and engaging in advocacy to address societal issues was also recommended.

- **Department** of Business Administration: It was recommended that businesses assume greater responsibility for economic, social, and environmental sustainability. Promoting entrepreneurship and social innovation among higher education learners was emphasized. The practice of publishing sustainability reports has become widespread globally, and companies must act to reduce their environmental and societal impact. Strategies to enhance business students' understanding of circular economy issues, waste management, and business models were deemed necessary.
- **Department of Computer Science:** It was recommended that research projects and collaboration on innovative intelligence computing systems be encouraged. Addressing cybersecurity challenges in Pakistan was highlighted, including the need for resources and expertise. New courses, such as Computer Forensics and Advanced Cybersecurity, should be introduced. The implementation of block-chain technology across industries to improve data security, reduce fraud, and enhance record accuracy was also suggested. Additionally, students should enhance their knowledge in related fields such as Robotics, AI, and Big Data analytics.
- Department of Language and Culture: It was recommended that culture and languages be integrated into curricula to enable learners to express and share their ideas with confidence. Promoting these languages on global platforms to support diversity,


pluralism, and cultural openness was emphasized. To preserve cultural heritage, cultural departments should be established across higher education institutions to train teachers and learners about cultural integrity through academic activities.
